NEPAL MEDICAL COUNCIL

ABSTRACT.

The great fire at Singha Durbar has had a posound effect on the regulation of medical practice in this country in that all the records upto 9th July, 1973 were destroyed by the fire of that date. It is ironic that a meeting of the Medical Council had been called on the day following the fire. This article, which is very incomplete, attempts to take stock of the present position, and hopes that response from the readers will result in a more comprehensive article at a later date. The initial formation of regulation regarding medical practice may be said to have been instituted in the Mulki Ain (Law of the Land) under the heading of 'Ilaz Garne Ko' (On Medical Practice).

The Nepal Medical Association, from the time that was formed on 20th Fagun, 2007, had however been advocating to the government the necessity of having a Medical Council Act for Nepal. At the time of the First All Nepal Medical Conference in 1963, a resolution to request H.M.'s Government to legislate a Medical Council Act and also a Drug Control Act was adopted. The passing of the Nepal Medical Council Act (Act No. 25 of 2020 and published in the Nepal Gazette of 16th, Fagun, 2020) in February 1964, was welcomed by the members of the profession. A plea for the early framing of the bye-laws was made.

MEDICAL COUNCIL.

What in fact is a Medical Council and what does it do? If one refers to the Medical Act of 1858 of the United Kingdom, one finds that the preamble starts by stating 'it is expedient that persons requiring medical aid should be enabled to distinguish qualified from unqualified practitioners'.

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The Mepal Medical Council has objectives such as these. The function of the Nepal Medical Council may be simply stated as to:-

- a) Protect the public, for example by maintaining and publishing a register of qualified doctors.
- b) Ensure a standard of medical education in Nepal plus also decide on registrable qualifications.
- c) Take disciplinary action against registered doctors for misconduct.

A notification which appeared in the Nepal Gazette of Bhadra 28th, 2022 states :-

"Under the powers delegated by Sub Clause (3) of Clause (1) of the Nepal Medical Council Act, 2020 B.S., His Majesty's Government has enforced the following clauses 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 31, 32 and 33 throughout the Kingdom of Nepal from 28th Bhadra."

Following this, a notification regarding the Chairman and members, both nominated and elected appeared in the Nepal Gazette of 2022/7/9 as follows:-

The same notification stated that under Clause 12 of the Nepal Medical Act. 2020, Shri Bimal Raj Basnyat, Section Officer, Health Sevirces had been appointed as Registrar of the Council. He was followed in that post by Mr. B.K. Thakur.

Being ex-officio member of the Nepal Medical Council it follows that all subsequent presidents of Nepal Medical Association, as listed below have during their tenure

A meeting of the Nepal Medica! Council held in Shrawan 2023 (1966) designed the emblem of the Council, suggested a Drug Control Act and also felt that a Register of doctors be completed.

Laws in accordance with the Medical Council Act 2020, were made and published in the Nepal Gazette of 2024/9/17.

Following the completion of the first three years, the Nepal Medical Association was asked by a letter dated 2025/10/4 to elect and send the names of four members. Subsequent elections led to the representation to the Nepal Medical Council as from 2026/8/17 by the undermentioned:

It should be noted that the election of these four plus all subsequently elected members has not been according to the Act. The Act provides that four representatives should be elected from amongst the registered members, whereas what is happening is that the four persons are being elected from members of the N.M.A who may or may not be registered with the Nepal Medical Council. Another discrepancy that tends to occur is that as the election occurs every two years, none of those elected actually serve the full tenure of three years on the council. In these circumstances therefore it would be more rational for the Nepal Medical Council to make its own arrangements to elect the four representatives from amongst those registered.

Perusal of available records show that the composition of the Council as on

A registration committee consisting of three doctors viz. Dr. B.B. Pradhan, Dr. B.P. Sharma and Dr. M.R. Baral was also formed.

The Council wanted enforcement of 26.2 and 26.3 of the Act, but as the Government felt that it was not practicable, the members requested that this be enforced at least in the Kathmandu Nagar Panchayat area.

Existing available records show the following as members at the specific periods :-

In April 1973, i.e. in Fagun 2029, the elected members were Dr. Bhasker Sharma, Dr. P.N. Shrestha, Dr. B.R. Prasai, Dr. H. Dixit was a nominated member.

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A decision was taken by the Nepal Medical Association to draw attention of the Nepal Medical Council to the fact that middle level health workers were passing themselves off as doctors in the rural areas.

In Shrawan 2036, the Nepal Medical Association also drew attention to the fact that persons to be nominated to the Nepal Medical Council had not yet been nominated and so the Council could not function. Letters were written to the Director General of Health to re-activate the Nepal Medical Council.

Matters came to a head in 1981 at the time of the 10th All Nepal Medical Conference. The president of the Nepal Medical Association and the elected members on the council were as follows:-

After various requests from the Nepal Medical Association, H.M.G. finally, nominated Dr. L.N. Prasad as Chairman with Dr. Jogendra Jha and Dr. S.K. Pahari as. the other members. Dr. M.R. Baral, having resigned from the Presidentship of the Nepal Medical Association, was replaced on the Council by Dr. B.K. Pradhan. The members got to work and it was pointed out that upto now although the Nepal Medical Association had sent the names of the elected members to the Council, there was in fact no legal standing in that the names had not been published in the Nepal Gazette. This was howsever finally done in Gazette of 19th Poosh, 2039. The term of office of these members is three years, following which, new nominations will have to be made or representatives elected from registered practitioners. The present council has decided to temporarily shift its office to one corner of the Nepal Medical Association. This is essential if the Council is to perform its duty as an autonomous body. The setting up of office, and the registration of doctors, which should be routine matters are proving to be Herculean tasks. The absence of records prior to 9th July. 1973 has meant that even our active list is incomplete. Requests to professional colleagues even through the medium of the daily paper has not elicited a response. The publication of the available records in the pages of the mouthpiece of the Nepal Medical Association will, I hope, prompt the readers to correspond so that future efforts in this line will lead to a complete and accurate active list of our professional colleagues.

ON MEDICAL PRACTICE

(His Majesty's Government, "Ilaj Garne Ko" (On Medical Practice). Muluki Ain, (Law of the Land) (1963 ed. 209-10pp.)

This translation of the 'ILAZ GARNE KO' section of the Muluki Ain has been supplied by The Law Books Management Committee of His Majesty's Government and may not be reproduced without permission. Our thanks are due to the Committee for allowing us to publish it.

SECTION 1

Major medical treatment or surgery and the prescription of medicines to be administered internally or to be applied externally after diagnosis of the disease may be done by qualified doctors and physicians (baidya) who have studied the subject and have appeared in examination and obtained certificates thereof. Persons who are skilled or experienced in diagnosing diseases or treating them may perform operations of minor wounds and boils, apply ointments and medicines and bandage them, even if they have not passed any qualifying examination.

SECTION 2

In case it is necessary to operate, take out or amputate anything in the body, the consent of the patient also if he is an adult and is in possession of his senses, and of his claiment guardian if he is a minor, or is devoid of his senses shall be necessary; and if he is a person without any claiment who needs to be operated upon, the doctor or the physician (baidya) may do so even without such consent if it is in the interest of the patient.

SECTION 3

In case qualified doctors and physicians (baidya) have to administer poisonous substances which have been processed according to the prescribed formula according to the nature of the disease, and have to sign a prescription to that effect, and such substances are administered in proper doses, no offence shall be deemed to have been

committed even if death results. In case a prescription is issued for poisonous substances which have not been processed according to the prescribed formula, or other poisonous substances the internal administration of which is said to result in death, or such substances administered to persons to whom these should not have been administered, and in case such substances are prescribed for internal administration in doses higher than is needed even to persons to whom these could be administered, or while operating any patient improperly anything untoward has happened, such doctor or physician, and in case the doctor or physician (baidya) has prescribed proper medicines in proper doses to the patient, but the pharmacist has altered the dosage, or mixed wrong ingredients, the pharmacist shall be deemed to have committed an offence punishable under this chapter.

SECTION 4

In case any person who is authorized to undertake treatment or surgery under Section I of this chapter undertakes such treatment or surgery but the patient who seeks such treatment or surgery gets worse or dies, or undergoes physical damage or pain, any medicine that is left over, and if none left, the prescription signed by the doctor or physican, the method and appliances used in the surgery, the fact as to whether the poisonous substances from among the medicines used on that occasion have been processed according to the prescribed formula or not, or whether the dosage of ingredients in other medicines is adequate according to the prescribed standard or not, or whether the medicine had to be administered necessarily according to the nature of the disease or not, or was administered wrongly, as well as other matters shall be examined properly through capable doctors and physicians; and in case the medicines include poisonous substances, the internal use of which results in death, these shall be tested by adminis tering them internally to dogs and goats. In course of such tests, if the dog or goatwhich takes the medicine dies, or it is proved that any medicine not suitable to the patient according to the nature of his disease was prescribed, or that the pnarmacist altered the dosage as compared to the standard dose, or that the medicine which was internally administered was not processed adequately or contained ingredients in inadequate quantities, or that the surgery was performed improperly, or that vaccination was performed with sub-standard vaccines, and in case it is further proved that such action was not performed with the intent to murder but was due to mistake or defective judgment, punishment shall be given according to Section 8 of this chapter.

SECTION 5

No person shall supply or sell intoxicating matter, poisonous substance of any kind or medicines containing poison without the prescription of a doctor or physician (baidya). In case any person so supplies or sells, he shall be deemed to have committed an offence punishable under this chapter.

SECTION 6

A person of deranged mind shall, until he is cured, be put in chains and lodged inside

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a cell or a jail for the sake of treatment, and be treated from hospital, if there is any In case his claiment undertake to take proper care of him, such person of deranged mind shall be handed over to their custody.

SECTION 7

No person shall, without making any arrangement for being looked after by another person, compel any sick servant or any sick person taking shelter in his house to move to any roadside place, shelter or inn. Any person acting in contravention of this provision by leaving the sick person unattended in places mentioned above shall be punished with fine not exceeding Rs 500. It shall be the duty of the police or Panchayat for making arrangement to render the sick person treatment in some hospital or dispensary, if there is no hospital or dispensary.

SECTION 8

Any person, who is authorized to undertake treatment, perform surgery and adminster medicine under section 1 of this chapter, causes death, physical injury, and pain to the patient due to has carelessness, negligence, irresponsibility and improper handling shall be liable for punishment with fine not exceeding Rs 500 or imprisonment not exceeding two years, or with both.

SECTION 9

Any person, not authorised under Section 1 of this chapter to undertake or perform surgery, undertakes treatment or performs surgery or vaccination for the benefit be liable in addition to the penalty prescribed in section 8 for punishment with fine not exceeding Rs. 100 or imprisonment not exceeding six months.

Provided that if no physical damage has been done to the patient, such person shall be liable for fine only of Rs 500.

SECTION 10

In case death of any person results in the course of treatment, no complaint, except where is a malicious intent, shall be entertained if filed after three months of death.

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THE GAZETTE

The following Act, as enacted by His Majesty King Mahendra Bir Bikram Shah Dev, is published for information of the general public.

LAW NO. 35 OF 2020

LAW ENACTED TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSTITUTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NEPAL MEDICAL COUNCIL;

PREAMBLE:

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the regulation of qualifications of medical practitioners through the Kingdom of Nepal and for the registration of such medical practitioners who, by virtue of their qualification in modern medicines, are sufficiently qualified in the scientific use of those modern medicines,

Therefore. His Majesty King Mahendra Bir Bikram Shah Dev, has made this Act on the advice and with the consent of the National Panchayat.

1. SHOR! TITLE, EXTENT AND COMMENCEMENT:

- (1) This Act may be called the Nepal Medical Council Act, 1964.
- (2) It extends throughout the Kingdom of Nepal
- (3) Section 1 of this Act shall come into force immediately and the other sections shall come into force in areas and from dates as are prescribed by His Majesty's Government from time to time by notifications published in the Nepal Gazette.

2. DEFINITIONS:

Unless otherwise required by the subject or the context, in the Act:

- (a) "Council" means the Nepal Medical Council established in accordance with Section 3.
- (b) "Hospital" includes lunatic asylum, orphanage, dispensary, health centres, hospitals, sanatorium, any place where sick persons are looked after, laboratory. X-ray clinic, nursing home and any other like place.
- (c) "Modern medicines" means the allopathic system of medicine.
- (d) "Medical Practitioner" means any person who has acquired the minimum qualifications in modern medicines as recognised by the Council and is engaged in practic relating thereto.
- (e) "Register" means the register maintained under this Act for the registration of names of medical practitioners.
- (f) "Registered Medical Practitioner" means a medical practitioner whose name has been enrolled the register.
- (g) "Registrar" means the registrar of the Council appointed under Section 12.
- (h) "Rules" means the rules made under this Act.
- (i) "By laws" means the rules made by the Council under this Act.

3. ESTABLISHMENT OF COUNCIL:

- (1) There shall be established a Council to be known as the Nepal Medical Council.
- (2) The Council shall be an autonomous and corporate body having perpetual succession. It shall have a common seal of its own for purposes of its business.
- (3) The Council may acquire, hold and transfer movable and immovable property. grant and accept contracts, and perform all such functions as are considered neccessary in carrying out the objective of this Act.
- (4) The Council may sue or be sued like a person.

4. CONSTUTION OF COUNCIL:

- (1) There shall be constituted a Council consisting of the following persons:
 - (a) Three medical practitioners nominated by His Majesty's Government from among the registered medical practitioners;
 - (b) Five persons from the Nepal Medical Association inculding its chairman and four other members of the Association to be elected by the registered medical practitioners of the Association from among themselves.
- (2) His Majesty's Government may appoint the chairman of the Council. Provided that in case the appointment is not made by His Majesty's Government, the Chair-

man shall be elected by the members of the Council by a majority vote.

(3) The members of the Council shall [also] elect the vice-chairman from among themselves by a majority vote.

5. TERM OF OFFICE OF CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS:

The members of the Council shall ordinarily hold office for a term of three years. Provided that the chairman nominated by His Majesty's Government shall hold office during its pleasure.

6. DISQUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS:

- (1) Persons of the following categories shall be disqualified for election or nomination to, or membership of the Council.
 - (a) Persons whose names have been removed from the register; or
 - (b) Persons who have been declared insolvent and bankrupt by a court, or
 - (c) Persons who have been convicted and punished by a court for criminal offences involving moral turpitude:

7. PERMISSION OF THE COUNCIL:

The Council may grant permission to any of its member to absent himself from its meetings for a maximum period of six months.

8. PUBLICATION IN GAZETTE:

The name of every member who is nominated or elected to the Council, or who is removed from it, shall be published in the Nepal Gazette.

9. ACTION NOT TO BE INVALID:

In case any action has been taken by the Council while the post of any member is vacant, or after a disqualified person is nominated or elected or continues in office, these actions shall not be deemed to become invalid merely by such reason.

10. FEES AND ALLOWANCES:

The chairman and other members of the Council shall receive fees and allowances as His Majesty's Government may prescribe by an order in consideration of their having attended and worked in any meeting of the Council or any of its committees.

11. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

The Council may, subject to the provisions of this Act and the rules, delegate its powers and assign functions to a committee consisting of one or more members.

12. REGISTRAR AND OFFICERS:

- (1) His Majesty's Government may appoint or nominate any person as registrar to discharge the functions prescribed in this Act and the rules made thereunder, and may depute any other person to discharge all of his functions during his absence.
 - (2) The Registrar appointed under Sub-section (1), or the person deputed to discharge his functions during his absence, shall also work as Secretary of the Council and of the Committee formed under Section 11, and such person shall be entitled to take part in the discussions of the meetings of the Committee or of the Council but shall not be entitled to vote.
- (3) The Registrar appointed under Sub-section (1) may be removed or suspended or otherwise punished in accordance with the provisions of the rules made under this Act.
 - (4) The Council may appoint such number of officers and staff as it may deem requisite with the approval of His Majesty's Government.
 - (5) The officers and staff appointed under Sub-section (4) shall work under the control and supervision of the Registrar.

13. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE REGITSRAR

- (1) It shall be the duty of the Registrar to accurately maintain the register according to this Act, the rules and the general and special orders of the Council, to enter in the register the names, addresses and qualifications of such medical practitioners as registered from time to time, to remove the names of medical practitioners who are dead or removed from membership, and to discharge all such functions as are prescribed by this Act and the rules.
- (2) In case any registered medical practitioner leaves his practice or changes his residence he shall notify the Registrar accordingly within one month thereof. In case the Registrar has reason to believe that any medical practitioner has changed his residence or left his practice, he shall send upto three letters to his registered address. In case the letters are returned, or in case no reply is received within three months of their delivery, publish the name of such medical practitioner, and if no information is received even within the next three months, the Registrar shall remove his name from the register and inform the Council accordingly.

Pr. vided that in case any person submits an application to the Registrar for restoration of his name so removed from the register on the ground that he had not received the letter sent by the Registrar in time or that he had not been able to reply due to circumstances beyond his control or for any other proper reason, or that he has resumed his practice, the Registrar may restore the name of any medical practitioner which was removed under this Sub-section and in case his name is so registered, fees as prescribed in the Rules shall be charged.

(3) The register maintained under this Act, shall be deemed to be a public document.

14. REGISTRATION OF NAMES

- (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the Rules, any person possessing the qualification mentioned in the Schedule of this Act may have his name enrolled in the Register by submitting an application in the form prescribed in the Rules for such registration.
- (2) In case any person possessing qualifications other than those mentioned in the Schedule of this Act is deemed by the Council as possessing the minimum qualifications in modern system of medical treatment, and the Council so recommends, His Majesty's Government may give direction for registration of the name of such person. After registration of his name, a certificate of regisshall be granted to him.
- (3) Fees as prescribed in the Rules shall be paid along with the application to be submitted under the Sub-section (1).

15. ACTION ON APPLICATION:

- (1) All applications filed for the enrolment of names in the Register under Subsection (1) of section 14 shall be submitted directly to the Registrar, who shall forward them to the committee formed by the Council for the purpose.
- (2) The committee shall submit a report with full particulars to the Council after ascertaining whether or not the applicant is a person possessing the qualifications mentioned in the Schedule, and whether or not his application conforms to the provisons of the rules.
- (3) The Council shall, after considering the report of the Committee submitted under Sub-section (2), shall do the following:--
 - (a) It may direct the Registrar to enroll the name of the applicant in the Register if he possesses the qualifications mentioned in the Schedule and his application conforms to the rules, and he has in respect thereto paid the fees as prescribed in the Rules.
 - (b) It may reject the application for registration and notify the applicant accordingly, explaining reasons therefore In case the application does not conform to the rules or the applicant has not paid the fees or does not possess the qualification as mentioned in the Schedule, it shall refuse registration and accordingly notify the applicant giving reasons for the decision.
- (4) In case the name of any applicant cannot be enrolled in the register under Clause (b) of Sub-section (3) by reason of his application not conforming to

the rules or his having not paid the fees, and in case he thereafter submits another application which conforms to the rules and pays the necessary fees, registration shall not be refused merely by reason of his name not having been enrolled earlier.

16. PROOF, INFORMATION AND PARTICULARS REQUIRED FOR REGISTERING NAMES:

Persons whose names are to be enrolled in the register under Sub-section (2) of Section 14, or who submit applications under Sub-section (1) of Section 14 for registration of their names, shall furnish the following evidence particulars and informations to the registrar:—

- (a) Reliable evidence to show that their names can be registered in accordance with the Schedule.
- (b) Particulars of their qualifications or title, registration number and the date of registration in the Register of any foreign medical council or similar other body, if their names are registered therein.
- (c) A written stipulation to the effect that they shall abide by their obligations in accordance with this Act and the Rules.

17. POWER OF COUNCIL TO REMOVE NAME FROM REGISTER AND DIRECT REGISTRATION:

- (1) The Council may direct the removal of the name of any registered medical practitioner from the Register in the following circumstances:--
 - (a) If he is convicted by a court for any criminal offence involving moral turpitude.
 - (b) If the Council by a two-third majority finds him guilty of professional misconduct.
- (2) In case the person whose name has been removed from the register under Sub-section (1), files an application to the Council for restoration of his name and offers satisfactory grounds for such request, and in case the Council deems it proper to register his name, is may direct the Registrar to restore his name after charging the fees prescribed in this respect in the rules, and in case the Council so directs, the Register shall restore his name accordingly and issue him a certificate of registration.

18. DISSOLUTION OF COUNCIL:

(1) In case His Majesty's Government feels that the Council has failed to exercise the powers vested in it under this Act and the rules, or has regularly misused its powers or has been acting beyond the limits of its

- powers, or has failed to discharge its duties under this Act and the rules, it shall notify the Council to improve upon or to rectify its action.
- (2) In case the Council fails to improve upon or to rectify its actions in accordance with the notification issued to it under Sub-section (1). His Majesty's Government may dissolve it and take over or assign some or all of the powers of duties exercised by it under this Act or the rules pending formation of another Council.
- (3) In case the Council is dissolved under Sub-section (2), His Majesty's Government shall take charge of its funds and other assets, and hand them over to the new Council when formed.
- (4) His Majesty's Government shall make arrangements to form a new Council in accordance with Section 4 ordinarily within three months from the date of the dissolution of the Council under Sub-section (2).

19. APPEAL:

- (1) Any person, not, satisfied with any decision made or action taken by the Registrar under this Act, may file an appeal to the Council within 35 days of such decision or action.
- (4) Any person, not satisfied with the decision of the Council, may file an appeal within three months from the date of such decision to the local district court, whose decision shall be final in the matter.

20 REMOVAL OF NAME FROM REGISTER:

In case the name of any person has been registered by fraud or mistake, and after investigation according to the rules such fraud or mistake is established, the Council may withdraw and cancel the certificate of such person.

21. RECOGNITION OF DEGREES, DIPLOMAS, LICENSES OR CERTIFICATES GRANTED BY MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS WITHIN THE KINGDOM OF NEPAL.

- (1) Any medical institution within the Kingdom of Nepal, which grants degrees, diplomas, licenses, certificates or title in respect of modern medicines may, submit application to His Majesty's Government for recognition thereof and in case His Majesty's Government, after receiving such applications and after consultation with the Council, deems it proper, it may, by a notification published in the Nepal Gazette recognise the degrees, diplomas, licenses or certificates granted or to be granted after a specified period by such medical institution.
- (2) No person or authority within the Kingdom of Nepal shall grant or issue any degree, diploma, license, certificate, or any other title pertaining to modern

medicines, except such degrees, diplomas, licenses or certificates as have been recognised under Sub-section (1).

(3) In case any institution, person of authority is found to have committed an offence in contravention of Sub-section (2), such institution, person or authority shall be fined with an amount not exceeding Rs 1,000.

22. POWER TO DIRECT SUBMISSION OF PARTICULARS:

It shall be the duty of any medical institution granting degrees, diplomas, licenses, certificates or titles recognized under Sub-section (1) of Section 21 to provide particulars in respect of the curriculum prescribed for such degrees, diplomas, licenses, certificates or titles, and the curriculum (text-books), the age-limit as well as other requisite matters prescribed for admission to examinations, which the council may from time to time demand.

23, INSPECTION OF EXAMINATIONS:

- (1) The Council shall appoint such number of medical inspectors as it may deem requisite for the inspection of examinations to be conducted by the concerned medical institutions for the purpose of granting degrees, diplomas, licenses or titles recognised under Sub-section (1) of Section 21.
- (2) The inspector appointed under Sub-section (1) shall report to the Council on the sufficiency and suitabilty of the examinations inspected by him and on any other matter in regard to which the council so requires.

 Provided that he shall not interfere in the conduct of such examinations.
- (3) On receipt of such report the Council shall after consideration thereof, direct the concerned medical institution to submit explanations within the specified date and shall then submit its report to His Majesty's Government along with the explanations if any, received within that date.

24. WITHDRAWAL OF RECOGOITION:

- (1) After considering the report received from the medical inspector under Section 23, in case the Council is satisfied that the curriculum or the examinations prescribed by the concerned medical institution for the purpose of granting degree, diploma, license or certificate recognized under Sub-section (1) of Section 21, or the standard of proficiency required at any examinations, are not suitable and adequate, it shall send a report to this effect to His Majesty, 8 Government.
- (2) His Majesty's Government after consideration of the report sent by the Council under Sub-section (1), may direct the concerned medical institution to submit explanations within the specified date, and after considering the explanation if

any, received within the specified date as well as after conducting such inquiry as it deems necessary, His Majesty's Government may, by a notification published in Nepal Gazette, withdraw recognition pertaining to any degree, diploma, license, certificate or title granted by such institution after a specified date, and may also, if it so deems proper, withdraw recognition of such institution.

25. SUITS AND OTHER LEGAL ACTION PROHIBITED

Unless provided for in this Act or the rules, no suit shall be or any 'other legal proceeding shall be taken in any court against any action taken by his Majesty's Government, the Council or the Registrar in exercise of the powers conferred by this Act or the rules.

- 26. UNREGISTERED PERSONS PROHIBITED FROM ENGAGING THEMSELVES IN MEDICAL PROFESSION:
 - (1) No person other than the registered medical practitioner, shall engage himself directly or indirectly in the profession of modern medicines.
 - (2) The Council may prohibit the sale or distribution of any specified type of medicine under prescripton of any person not being a registered medical practitioner, and may also specify specifications of such medicines.
 - (3) In case any person acts in contravention of the provision of this Scotion, he shall be fined for the first time with an amount not exceeding Rs 200 and for each such subsequent offence, with fine not exceeding Rs 500.

27. PENALTY FOR USE OF TITLE PERTAINING TO MEDICAL QUALIFICATIONS

- (1) No person shall add or cause to be added to his name any degree, diploma, certificate, license or title pertaining to modern medicines not obtained by him with the purpose of practising in modern medicines.
- (2) In case any person is found to have committed an offence by acting in contravention of Sub-section (1), he shall be fined with an amount not exceeding Rs 500 for the first time and for every such subsequent offence with fine not exceeding Rs 1000.

28. PROSECUTION

- (a) In case the Council is of the opinion that it is necessary to file suits against any person or institution for contravening the provisions of this Act, it may after passing a resolution to his effect send its request to His Majesty's Government.
- (b) His Majesty's Government may authorise in writing any officer to file such suits.

29. ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES BY REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS:

Any registered medical practitioner shall be entitled to do the following things:-

- (1) Attest according to Nepal laws certificates of births and deaths.
- (b) Affix his signature and issue certificates about the medical, physical or mental fitness.

30. SPECIAL PROVISION FOR REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS

Special preference may be given to registered medical practitioners in the appointment of medical practitioners under the Health Service of His Majesty's Government.

31. POWER OF HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT TO MAKE AMENDMENTS IN SCHEDULE:

His Majesty's Government may, after consulation with the Council, by an order published in the Nepal Gazette affect such amendments in the Schedule to this Act, as it may deem necessary.

32. POWER TO MAKE RULES:

- (1) His Majesty's Government, after consulations with the Council, may make rules to carry out the purpose of this Act.
- (1) Without prejudice to the generality of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) such rules may provide for the following matters.
 - (a) Meetings of the Council and procedures there for;
 - (b) Procedure for electing members of the council under Section 4.
 - (c) Powers and duties of the chairman and members of the Council.
 - (d) Arrangement regarding the funds and assets of the Council.
 - (e) Remunerations of the chairman and members of the Council.
 - (f) Necessary provisions regarding conditions of service, salary, allowances, punishment and dismissal of the Registrar and other employees.
 - (g) Prescribe form for the register of the registered medical practitioners to be maintained under this Act.
 - (h) Publication of lists of medical treatments.
 - (i) Fees to be charged under this Act and the form of Applications.
 - (i) Procedure about forming committees and powers and duties thereof.
 - (k) Keeping of accounts.
 - (1) Collection of registers and publication thereof.

JNMA Apr-June (1983)

- (m) Procedure of hearing appeals by the council against the decisions of Registrar.
- (n) Other provisions required for the efficient discharge of the functions of the Council.

33. BYE-LAWS:

- (1) Subject to this Act and the rules, the Council may, with the approval of His Majesty's Government, make bye-laws for other matters as are deemed necessary.
- (2) The Council may make amendments in such bye-laws by a majority of two-third of its members. In case it so drems proper, it may recommend to His Majesty's Government for amendments in this Act by passing resolution to this effect by a majority of two-third of its members.

SCHEDULE

RECOGNISED DEGREES

1. Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates, licenses, title etc as may be recognised by His Majesty' Government from time to time on the recommendation of the Council.
